

Is your home ready for staging?

Preparation is the key to successfully staging and listing your home, here is how to prepare for your upcoming staging.

Construction should be complete:

Any repairs, remodeling, painting, floor refinishing etc. should be completed before staging takes place.

All items prepared as recommended:

Any decluttering, cleaning, furniture rearranging recommended during your walkthrough should be completed prior to staging.

Utilities:

Utilities must be operational for staging to occur. This includes running water, heat and working electricity.

Contract:

The staging contract must be signed before we can begin staging.

Access:

A contractor box must be on the house. We can provide one if requested and a key must be in it or provided. This box must stay on the house while it is staged.

Cleaning:

Home should be thoroughly cleaned, including carpets and windows. A professional cleaning is highly recommended.

Pets:

For the safety of your pets and our team, please confine pets for the duration of your staging.

Landscaping and outside work:

Outside work and landscaping can not interfere with our ability to stage on your stage day (painting or pressure washing porch or decks etc.)

Driveway:

The driveway must be clear and accessible so we can park our truck and easily unload staging furniture into the house.

Plan to be offsite:

In order for us to efficiently do our job; homeowners and contractors should not be at the house during staging.

Fees:

Homes that are not stage ready may incur fees for additional time spent or return visits. Please let us know as soon as possible if your house/listing will not be ready for staging on the agreed date.
